

# What are Directional Signs?

## Worksheet

Directional signs are traffic signs that show routes to destinations, cities and highways. They use arrows and text to guide drivers along the correct road and toward their intended direction.

## Answer Key

1. B) To guide vehicles to destinations — Directional signs help drivers navigate by showing routes to cities, towns and destinations.
2. C) Green and white — Green with white text is the standard colour for main route directional signs.
3. C) Tourist attraction to the left — Brown signs indicate tourist attractions and points of interest. The arrow shows the direction.
4. B) Turn right to reach the destination — Right-pointing arrows guide drivers to turn right or continue right toward the destination.
5. A green directional sign with white text indicates the direction to a city or destination. The arrow pointing straight means you should continue in that direction. The sign confirms you are on the correct route.
6. Brown directional signs indicate tourist attractions or points of interest. The left-pointing arrow means the attraction is to your left. Turn left if you wish to visit the site.
7. White directional signs at intersections show the route to reach your destination. A right arrow means the correct route is to the right. Turn right to stay on the correct path.
8. To guide drivers to cities, towns, highways and destinations using arrows and text.
9. Green with white text — the standard colour for main route and highway direction signs.
10. Brown signs show tourist attractions, national parks and points of historical interest.

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
