

What are Pedestrian Crossing Rules?

Worksheet

At pedestrian crossings, drivers must yield to pedestrians and slow down or stop to ensure safe passage. Pedestrians must cross only at marked areas and wait for a safe moment.

Questions

1. At a marked pedestrian crossing, who has priority?
A) The driver always
B) The pedestrian
C) Both equally
D) Whoever is faster
2. A pedestrian is crossing outside a marked crossing zone. Is this legal?
A) Yes, always
B) No, only in marked crossings
C) Yes, if no cars are coming
D) Only at night
3. As a driver, what should you do when approaching a pedestrian crossing?
A) Speed up
B) Honk and continue
C) Slow down and be ready to stop
D) Flash your lights
4. If a pedestrian crosses against the signal or outside a crossing, who is responsible?
A) Always the driver
B) Always the pedestrian
C) Both — the pedestrian should obey rules; drivers must still try to avoid hitting them
D) Neither
5. You approach a pedestrian crossing and see people waiting to cross. What should you do?
6. A pedestrian is already crossing in a marked crossing zone when you approach. Are they legal?
7. You see a pedestrian waiting on the curb at a marked crossing. What is your responsibility?
8. Define: Do drivers have to stop for pedestrians in crossings?
9. Define: Can a pedestrian cross anywhere on the road?
10. Define: What if a pedestrian crosses without looking?

Answer Key

1. B) The pedestrian — Pedestrians in marked crossings have the right of way — drivers must yield.
2. B) No, only in marked crossings — Pedestrians must use marked crossings — crossing elsewhere is illegal.
3. C) Slow down and be ready to stop — Slow down and prepare to stop to ensure pedestrian safety.
4. C) Both — the pedestrian should obey rules; drivers must still try to avoid hitting them — Pedestrians must follow rules, but drivers must also make reasonable efforts to avoid collisions.
5. 1. Reduce your speed as you approach the crossing 2. Check if pedestrians are moving or about to cross 3. Stop your vehicle at a safe distance before the crossing and let them pass
6. 1. Yes — pedestrians crossing in a marked zone have the right of way 2. You must stop and wait for them to finish crossing 3. Do not honk or try to speed through
7. 1. Anticipate that they may cross at any moment 2. Slow down before reaching the crossing 3. Be ready to stop completely if they step into the crossing
8. Yes — pedestrians in marked crossings have the right of way; drivers must stop or yield.
9. No — pedestrians must use marked crossings. Crossing elsewhere is illegal and dangerous.
10. Drivers must still try to avoid hitting them, but pedestrians also bear responsibility for their own safety.

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
