

What are Roundabout Rules?

Worksheet

Roundabout rules require you to yield to traffic already in the roundabout, stay in the correct lane while circling, and signal your exit. Priority goes to vehicles on the roundabout, not entering.

Questions

1. Entering a roundabout with traffic inside, what do you do?
A) Enter immediately
B) Yield and wait for a gap
C) Speed up to merge
D) Use hazard lights
2. Inside a roundabout, taking the second exit. Which lane?
A) Left lane
B) Right lane
C) Middle lane
D) Any lane
3. How far ahead of an exit should you signal?
A) 10 meters
B) 30 meters
C) 50 meters or 3 seconds
D) 100 meters
4. In a one-lane roundabout, how many times can you go around?
A) Once, then exit
B) Unlimited, until your exit
C) Twice maximum
D) Only once if another car is there
5. Approaching a roundabout, a car is inside circling. Can you enter?
6. Inside the roundabout, you're taking the third exit. Which lane?
7. Two lanes in a roundabout. You're exiting left. From which lane?
8. Define: Who has priority in a roundabout?
9. Define: When entering a roundabout, where do you look?
10. Define: Should you signal when exiting a roundabout?

Answer Key

1. B) Yield and wait for a gap — Vehicles in the roundabout have priority. You must yield and wait for a safe gap to enter.
2. A) Left lane — Second exits (straight) use the left or center lane, depending on the roundabout design.
3. C) 50 meters or 3 seconds — Signal 50 meters (about 3 seconds) ahead to give other drivers time to react.
4. A) Once, then exit — Go around only as many times as needed to reach your exit. One complete circle is typical for one exit.
5. No, traffic inside the roundabout has priority. Yield and wait for a safe gap. Result: Only enter when the inner lane is clear for your desired exit.
6. Use the right lane for a third exit (right turn). Stay in that lane and signal before exiting. Result: Safe, predictable exit.
7. Exit from the left lane when making a left turn. Signal before you start leaving the roundabout. Result: Clear intent, no collision risk.
8. Traffic already inside the roundabout. Entering vehicles must yield.
9. Look left for traffic inside the roundabout before merging.
10. Yes, signal your exit 50m (about 3 seconds) before leaving to alert other drivers.

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
