

What are Yield Sign Rules and Priority?

Worksheet

At a yield sign, you must give way to traffic on the main road or from your right. Slow down, check for traffic, and proceed only when it is safe.

Questions

1. What should you do when you see a yield sign?
A) Speed up
B) Stop immediately
C) Slow down and check for traffic
D) Turn around
2. Is a full stop required at every yield sign?
A) Yes, always
B) No, only if there is traffic
C) No, you never stop
D) Only at night
3. At a yield sign, who has priority?
A) The secondary road vehicle
B) The main road vehicle
C) Both equally
D) The vehicle that honks
4. What is the shape and color of a yield sign?
A) Red octagon
B) Yellow square
C) White triangle with red border
D) Blue circle
5. You approach a yield sign on a secondary road meeting the main road. You see a car on the main road approaching. What should you do?
6. A yield sign is ahead. The main road is clear with no vehicles visible. Can you proceed?
7. At a yield sign, two vehicles approach from different directions on the main road. How do you proceed?
8. Define: What does a yield sign mean?
9. Define: Do you have to stop at a yield sign?
10. Define: Who has priority at a yield sign?

Answer Key

1. C) Slow down and check for traffic — A yield sign requires you to slow down and check the main road for traffic before proceeding.
2. B) No, only if there is traffic — A full stop is required only if there is traffic — you may proceed if the main road is clear.
3. B) The main road vehicle — Main road traffic has priority — secondary road vehicles must yield.
4. C) White triangle with red border — A yield sign is a white (inverted) triangle with a red border.
5. 1. Slow down your vehicle as you approach the yield sign 2. Check for traffic on the main road in both directions 3. Yield to the approaching car — do not enter the main road until it passes
6. 1. Slow down and approach carefully 2. Verify that the main road is completely clear in both directions 3. Proceed smoothly onto the main road when you are sure it is safe
7. 1. Maintain caution and slow your speed significantly 2. Let both main road vehicles pass 3. Enter the main road only after both vehicles have passed and it is safe
8. Slow down and give way to traffic on the main road or from your right — do not enter until it is safe.
9. Not always — only if there is traffic. If the main road is clear, you can proceed without stopping.
10. Traffic on the main road has priority — secondary road vehicles must yield.

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
