Future perfect simple is formed with will have + past participle, expressing an action that will be finished by or before a specified future time.

Answer Key

1. C) He will have finished by Friday. — Future perfect simple uses will have + past participle (finished). Option 0 is simple future, option 3 is present perfect.
2. B) An action will be completed before a future time — FPS shows completion by a specific future moment.
3. B) will have found — 'Will have found' (FPS) indicates the cure will be discovered before 2030.
4. B) I will have eaten dinner when you call. — 'Will have eaten' correctly pairs will have with the past participle (eaten).
5. Reference point in future: next Friday Action: finish the project Structure: will have + past participle (finished) Meaning: The project will be done before Friday arrives
6. Reference point: when you arrive (future) Action: prepare dinner Tense: will have + past participle (prepared) Meaning: Dinner will be ready before you get there
7. Reference point: next summer (future) Duration: 10 years of living Structure: will have + past participle (lived) Time phrase: by next summer shows the completion point
8. An action that will be completed before a specific future time; formed with will have + past participle.
9. will + have + past participle (e.g., will have finished, will have arrived, will have written).
10. To show an action will be completed before a stated future time or another future event.

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
