3. B) Three actions in chronological sequence — Three Past Simple verbs show a clear narrative sequence—one action completed, then the next.
4. B) The main sequence of plot events — Past Simple excels at the main narrative—the sequence of key events that drive the story forward.
5. Past Simple chains events: walked → noticed → opened. Each action completed, each followed by the next in sequence. This chronological structure is essential for coherent narrative.
6. Events flow in chronological order using Past Simple. Each sentence advances the plot: problem → search → resolution. Past Simple gives the reader clear, linear understanding of what happened when.
