

# What Are Possessive Adjectives?

Possessive adjectives (my, your, his, her, its, our, their) show ownership and come before nouns. They match the possessor, not the thing possessed.

## Answer Key

1. C) our — We (plural 1st person) → our.
2. B) your — You → your.
3. A) mine — Stands alone → possessive pronoun (mine). Adjective needs a noun.
4. A) its — Possessive adjective for 'it' = its (no apostrophe).
5. I = owner Possessive adjective = my Answer: My pen is blue.
6. They = owners (plural) Possessive adjective = their Answer: Their dog is big.
7. She = owner (female singular) Possessive adjective = her Answer: Her bag is on the table.
8. Words (my, your, his, her, its, our, their) that show who owns something.
9. Yes — always use with a noun (my book, not just my).
10. His — His car is red.
