1. C) at — 'At' is used for specific times like 5 pm.
2. D) for — 'For' shows the duration of studying.
3. C) During — 'During' shows when (during the period of the movie).
4. B) on — 'On' is used for days: on weekdays, on Monday, on Friday.
5. Use 'at' for specific times. 3 o'clock is exact → use 'at'. Correct timing.
6. Use 'during' for periods of time. Exam is a period → use 'during'. Correct usage.
7. Use 'for' to show duration. Two hours is length of time → use 'for'. Correct duration.
8. Words showing when something happens — in, on, at, for, during, before, after, since, until.
9. 'At' for exact times: at 9 am, at midnight, at dawn, at noon.
10. 'In' for longer periods: in 2024, in summer, in the afternoon, in the morning.
