

What is Present Perfect Tense?

Present perfect is have/has + past participle, used for past actions relevant to now. Example: I have finished my homework (it's done now).

Answer Key

1. B) have read — have read = present perfect (life experience up to now).
2. B) have/has + past participle — Present perfect = have/has + past participle (3rd form).
3. C) I have eaten breakfast. — have eaten = present perfect (action in past, result now).
4. B) I have visited Paris three times. — have visited = present perfect for experience from past to now.
5. have lived = present perfect (started in past, continues to now) Time: for 10 years (duration from past to present) Formation: have + past participle (lived)
6. has finished = present perfect (completed, result visible now) Adverb: already (emphasizes completion) Formation: has + past participle (finished)
7. have never visited = present perfect + negative experience Life experience: from past to now, no experience Formation: have + never + past participle (visited)
8. have/has + past participle, connecting past actions to present time.
9. have/has + past participle. Example: have gone, has eaten, have studied.
10. For actions that started in the past and affect the present, or life experiences.

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
