Questions

1. A 'connecting flight' means:

1. A) a flight that connects to another flight — A connecting flight requires a stop and a change of plane before continuing.
2. B) a package with meals and activities included — All-inclusive resorts include accommodation, food, drinks, and activities in one price.
3. B) bags and suitcases — Luggage is baggage—cases and bags for carrying belongings on a trip.
4. B) a notable place or monument of interest — A landmark is a famous building, monument, or natural feature that tourists visit.
5. 1. All-inclusive resort: a hotel package with meals/activities included 2. Itinerary: your planned schedule of activities 3. Transfer: transportation from airport to hotel
6. Excursion: a short trip for sightseeing (usually a day). Expedition: a long, planned journey into remote or challenging areas. Example: 'city excursion' vs. 'Amazon expedition.'
7. You go to baggage claim to collect your luggage. Then take a transfer (shuttle or taxi) to your hotel. Finally, check-in at the reception desk.
8. A detailed plan or schedule of a trip, listing dates, destinations, and activities.
9. The process of arriving at a hotel and registering at the reception desk.
10. A stop between flights, longer than a 'connection' (e.g., 4 hours vs. 1 hour).

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
