Answer Key

1. B) Atmospheric conditions at a place — Weather describes current atmospheric conditions like temperature, rain and wind.
2. D) Winter — Winter is the cold season.
3. B) Containing a lot of moisture in the air — Humid means there is a lot of moisture in the air; the opposite is dry.
4. B) Leaves fall — In autumn, trees lose their leaves.
5. Today is sunny (bright with no clouds) and warm (pleasant temperature). The wind (moving air) is mild (not strong). There's a 20% chance of rain (water falling from clouds).
6. I prefer summer (the warm season from June to August). The weather is hot (high temperature), and the days are long. I like swimming outdoors. In winter (cold season), it often snows (snow falls).
7. In spring, flowers bloom and temperatures rise. In autumn, leaves fall (trees lose leaves), and it becomes cooler. Both seasons have mild weather and rainy days.
8. The current atmospheric conditions at a specific place — temperature, wind, rain, clouds, etc.
9. Spring, summer, autumn (fall), and winter.
10. 'Hot' = high temperature; 'warm' = pleasant, comfortable temperature.

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
