

What is Double Negation & Litotes?

Worksheet

Double negation uses two negative markers (ne ... pas/aucun/jamais) for emphasis in formal French. Litotes is stylistic understatement (saying 'not bad' to mean 'good') common in literature.

Answer Key

1. A) ai — ne + verb + aucun forms double negation. 'ne vois aucun' or 'n'ai aucun.'
2. C) It's good — Litotes: saying 'not bad' = it's good (understatement for effect).
3. B) Formal/literary negation — Literary contexts allow ne without pas: 'He never comes' with elegant brevity.
4. C) Rarely, for emphasis — Modern spoken French avoids it; used formally or deliberately for dramatic effect.
5. Subject: Je Double negation: ne ... pas aucun Verb: fais Meaning: I make no effort at all (emphasis). OR: I do make some effort (double negative cancels, but formal usage treats it as emphatic).
6. Literal: It is not bad. Litotes meaning: It is good! Context: Elegant understatement; used when direct praise seems too emphatic.
7. Subject: Il Verbless negation: ne ... guère (barely/hardly) Common in literary/formal contexts: There is hardly any reason to doubt. = There is no good reason to doubt.
8. Two negative markers (ne + pas/aucun/jamais) used together for emphasis in formal/literary style.
9. pas de = general negation (some/any). aucun = absolute negation (not a single one).
10. Stylistic understatement: saying 'not bad' to mean 'good' or 'not difficult' to mean 'easy.'

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
