6. livres = plural use ses (regardless of gender, plural always -s) answer: Ses livres sont sur la table
7. professeurs = plural, we = plural owner use notre before plural answer: Nos professeurs sont sympas
8. My (used before masculine singular nouns).
9. Before feminine singular nouns (ma mère, ma soeur).
10. mes (mes parents, mes amies).

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
