

SAT Karşılaştırma Dereceleri Nedir?

Çalışma Kağıdı

Karşılaştırma dereceleri, iki veya daha fazla şey arasındaki farkları belirtmek için kullanılır. Tek heceli sıfat ve zarflar genellikle '-er' ve '-est' ekleriyle, çok heceliler ise 'more' ve 'most' ile yapılır. Düzensiz fiillerin (good, bad, far) kendine özgü formları vardır.

Cevap Anahtarı

1. A) more — 'Interesting' is a multi-syllable adjective, so we use 'more' to form the comparative degree when comparing two items (this book and the last one).
2. A) tallestest — The superlative form of 'tall' is 'tallest'. Adding '-est' again ('tallestest') is redundant and grammatically incorrect. The correct form is 'the tallest'.
3. C) She runs more quickly than him. — 'Quickly' is an adverb. Its comparative form is 'more quickly'. 'Quicklier' and 'quickest' are not standard English forms.
4. 1. Identify the items being compared. 2. Check if the correct form of the adjective/adverb is used (e.g., -er, more). 3. Ensure the comparison is logical and grammatically sound. Example: - Incorrect: The red car is more faster than the blue car. - Correct: The red car is faster than the blue car. - Incorrect: This is the most best cake I've ever eaten. - Correct: This is the best cake I've ever eaten.
5. The sentence is actually correct. 'More beautifully' is the comparative form of the adverb 'beautifully' (used to compare two people: 'she' and 'her sister'). 'Most gracefully' is the superlative form of the adverb 'gracefully' (implied comparison among multiple people, or the highest degree of gracefulness in general).
6. The Nile River is being compared to the Amazon River (two items). For the one-syllable adjective 'long', the comparative form is 'longer'. Therefore, the correct sentence is: 'The Amazon River is longer than the Nile River.'
7. -er (örn. taller, faster)
8. -est (örn. tallest, fastest)
9. more (örn. more beautiful, more carefully)
